

#### Who's Who

Bob Pells (Director)—Bob is a 37 year veteran of CDC. He has appeared in Charlie Brown, Lend me a tenor, Solid Gold Cadillac, Rumors, Kiss Me Kate and The Fantastiks. Additionally, Bob has directed many shows and served as President, VP, treasurer and a board member. In real life Bob has retired twice and currently sells real estate. He is the proud grandfather of Anna Catherine.

Elizabeth Howard (Producer)—Liz has made appearances in *The Most Happy Fella, Solid Gold Cadillac,* and several children's theater productions. She has worked backstage on almost every committee there is and currently serves as our production VP. Liz has enjoyed her years at CDC working with her daughter Sandy and wishes to thank the production staff for their time and effort.

Ken Leonowicz (Stage Manager)--Ken has been a club member for 3 years and has worked on every show since he got here. He has spent many hours painting, building and decorating sets. He has also worked on lighting and stage crews. Ken currently serves on the board of governors.
