

#### Who's Who

Drude Sparre Roessler (Director) is a long time member of CDC with a wealth of experience directing and performing in musical theater, opera, oratorio and concert music. For CDC she has directed Peter Pan, Follies, Annie, Most Happy Fella and Forever Plaid and appeared in South Pacific, Cinderella and as Mama Rose in Gypsy. She has served on our Board and in many other capacities. Drude has been seen in numerous roles with other companies and directed even more, including 46 student musicals. Kiss Me Kate is actually her favorite role, as she played opposite her then new husband Charlie, and they had great fun with the name calling and slapping each other around! She recently retired from more than 40 years of music instruction in the public school systems. Jonathan Flowers (Music Director) is an accomplished conductor and pianist, and a published composer.
