

DIRECTOR'S NOTE - LOVE, LIFE AND LOVE LOST

On November 17, 1994 Smokey Joe's Café began its pre-Broadway run at the Ahmanson/Doolittle Center in Los Angeles. It opened at the Virginia Theatre on Broadway to rave reviews on March 2, 1995 where it ran for five years to become the longest-running musical revue in the history of Broadway. Smokey Joe's Café was awarded the 1995 Grammy® for Best Musical Show Album and was honored with nominations for seven 1994-1995 Tony® Awards. Over the years there have been three major national tours, a two-year run in London's West End and premieres in over 15 other countries. In 2003 Smokey Joe's Cafe first became available to community theater groups.

Smokey Joe's Café was just the 2nd Broadway show I had seen and I remember vividly sitting in the front row enjoying the energy, harmony and talent of the Broadway cast. Although I left the theater entertained, I felt there was something missing. Smokey Joe's Cafe is a musical revue. There is no plot, just nine extremely powerful performers singing the glory of the fifties in America one song after another. If there is one thing that can describe that era, it is certainly the music. Two men were behind it all. Smokey Joe's Cafe is in honor of them, Jerry Leiber and Mike Stoller. Songs written by the duo are strung cleverly together one following another, featuring wonderful choreography and wonderful comedy.

When I was asked to direct this production I immediately thought of how I could turn this "story-less" review into a "production". I played with 30 or so concepts, but none would work entirely with the variety of music set before us. It wasn't until I auditioned this group of talented people that my concept really came together. What did all of this music have in common? Leiber and Stoller were fantastic storytellers with vivid details in their lyrics. Every song dealt with a relationship, whether it be a friendship, romance or environment. As the cast came together as an ensemble I was able to weave a web of relationships, found, forgotten, lost, and rekindled to create this loose plot around the music of *Smokey Joe's Café*. The missing piece of the puzzle. I wish to thank everyone involved with making my vision a reality.
