DIRECTORS NOTE

Thank you for coming to see CDC Community Theatre's Production of Aida.

When Theatre President, Karen Chamis came to me more than a year ago and asked which musical I would like to direct this season, my response was instantly "AIDA". Not only is this a beautiful love story, but its core message is relevant to today's audiences. In a world that still has issues with race, religion, and cultural differences, Aida is a story that celebrates the idea of looking beyond the color of one's skin and the cultural differences in the world. It is a celebration of love, life and the desire to find that one soul-mate, an ideal many have given up on today. If you have come to the theater this evening expecting to see a replication of the Broadway production, I am afraid you will be disappointed. Therefore, I feel re-creations should be just that, a new and fresh look at what the authors wrote, interpreting for yourself what the creators had in mind and how cast members should be interpreting these roles.

Community Theater, always being tight on budget, allows communities to find new and creative ways to tell the story. (That is my favorite part of Community Theater.) In this production I have focused on the story telling, without elaborate sets, to convey its message to you. Instead, I decided to use one of the most coveted and creative pieces of Egyptian Culture, fabric! Fabric was an important element in Egyptian Culture and is spoken about throughout this piece. The other important element we concentrated on in this production was lighting. This not only sets the mood of *Aida*, but can also provide for the many different

settings in this piece. I am excited that for the first time in its long history, CDC will be using moving lights in tonight's production. Thank you to all the patrons and benefactors that made it possible for CDC to upgrade it's electric.

The cast you are about to meet is an incredibly hard-working and passionate group of people, backed up by an equally dedicated support team. I have been lucky and honored to have them share my vision for *Aida*. In closing, I hope that you enjoy tonight's performance and find our new interpretation of *Aida* to be creative and insightful. 
Who's Who
