

Bob Pells (Director) - Bob has been a member of CDC for 46 years, serving in the past as President and as a board member. In his time at CDC he has been involved in some capacity in over 140 productions, including directing, acting, working back stage, and (most recently) working in the box office. The first show Bob directed, 35 years ago, was *The Mousetrap*; this production may be his swan song. His favorite productions include *Fantasticks*, *Pirates of Penzance*, *Noises Off*, and about 35 others. Now retired with 2 grandchildren, Bob loves to travel, read, gamble and play bridge. Many thanks to all members of the cast and crew who worked so diligently to make this a success.

Bill Chamis (Producer) - Bill has been involved with the CDC since 2002. Marc Chandler (Set designer and Construction Manager) Marc is a long-time member of CDC Theatre, both on and off stage. His many set designs include: Arsenic and Old Lace, Godspell (Perry Nomination) Kiss Me Kate, Nosies Off, The Sound of Music, Lost In Yonkers, To Kill a Mockingbird, The Trip to Bountiful (Perry Nomination), The Light in the Piazza, Grease, and Oliver. 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
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
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CDC COMMUNITY THEATRE -- HISTORY

The Cranford Dramatic Club is the longest continuously producing community theatre in the state of New Jersey. A small group of townspeople wanted to share good theatre with family, friends and neighbors. The first meeting took place in October 1919 and the CDC has produced shows in Cranford every year since then.

The first performance took place in Trinity Episcopal Church's Sherlock Hall. In the 1920s, they moved to the now-defunct Cranford Casino. After World War II, many of the shows were produced at Cranford High School. In the mid 1950s, a group of CDC members decided to build their own theatre. With their names listed on the mortgage guarantee, they began what would become the CDC Theatre, officially opening to the public in 1957.

In 1992, the theatre underwent renovation--a new front facade, new chairs, modernized plumbing and storage areas. In 2003, the lighting system was overhauled, adding a dropped ceiling, lighting instruments, and a computer-operated dimming system. Fundraising efforts allowed for the addition of a handicapped-accessible bathroom in the lobby.

This season's offerings include Oliver, Mouse Trap, and Carousel.
