and funding for years, the


creation of the Gay Men's Health Crisis, and of course,

"It's going to be hard to imagine CDC without Madge", that was the reply that longtime member Judi Chandler sent me after hearing of Madge's sudden passing. And I think that sentiment rings true for countless people that have known her through the theater over the years.

I only interacted with Madge a few brief times over the past year but I remember her as a larger than life personality, a tell it like it is kind of person, and a lady with a great laugh. I asked her what she had done at CDC when she was more active and she responded with "Well I've been on the stage, been

on the board, done costuming, done props, directed, I was heavily involved with the children's shows, and pretty much everything under the sun." Her love of the CDC was evident at her service as well. Huge pictures of her on stage were blown up for all to see, the playbills of all the CDC shows she was a part of were thoughtfully laid out for friends to look through and reminisce, the program even featured her turn in CDC's Nunsense. Madge is survived by her loving husband of 55 years, Edward, sons Edward C. and Keith, daughter-in-law Claudia, grandchildren Lauren, Luke, and Julia, and brother William and sister Joan.
